
AMERICAN SMALL BUSINESSES: BY THE NUMBERS

There are around **28 million** small businesses, and **18,500** "large" companies of more than **500 employees.**




Small business accounted for **65 percent** of net new jobs **since 1995**



Half of all new small businesses survive five+ years, one-third make it more than 10 years.



Small businesses that create new patents for products produced **16 times** more patents per employee than large patenting firms.



Nearly **8 in 10** small businesses are self-employed, and have no other employees besides themselves.

8 in 10 SMALL BUSINESSES ARE SELF-EMPLOYED

More than **half** of the American workforce works in a small business and **52 percent** of small businesses are home-based.



OF THE AMERICAN WORKFORCE WORKS IN A SMALL BUSINESS

In March 2011,-5.5 percent - self-employed small business owners were unemployed the year before. Only 3.6 percent in 2006 and 3.1 percent in 2001 were able to say the same.

SMALL BUSINESSES OWNERS UNEMPLOYED

2011 → 5.5% 2006 → 3.6% 2001 → 3.1%

Since 2008, more small businesses have closed than have opened. (2008-2009 = 518,500 'births' and 680,716 'deaths')
